




Program Highlights for 2021

- 7,996 households assisted
- 18.072 individuals assisted
- 3,387 individuals assisted who are disabled
- 4,412 senior citizens received services
- 5,976 individuals assisted who are children
- 2,908 individuals are at age 65 or above
- 4,267 single person households
- 6,394 individuals had no health insurance
- 2.079 households own their home
- 4,400 households had incomes at or below 100% of the federal poverty guidelines
- 9,284 individuals obtained non-emergency LIHEAP energy assistance
- 5,176 individuals received utility arrears assistance
- 1,229 participants obtained health care services for themselves and/or family member(s)

- 1,189 individuals received coaching/case management services
- 157 participants were unemployed and obtained a job
- 72 participants achieved living wage employment
- 22 participants employed increased their income through wage, hours or benefit increase
- 203 job placements were achieved
- 255 participants received budgeting, credit management, credit repair or credit counseling
- 71 participant saving accounts were started
- 14,842 referrals for services were made
- 2,766 individuals received rent or mortgage assistance
- 388 parents/caregivers improved their home environment
- 795 household maintained safe and affordable housing
- 8,735 food boxes were distributed
